What is the Alternative FAFSA?

Undocumented students may qualify for Federal and State financial aid programs. Additionally, undocumented students may qualify for Rhode Island Promise if they meet all other eligibility requirements. Undocumented student applicants are required to file the RI Alternative Application for State Postsecondary Student Financial Assistance.

Why is it important?

Students must complete the FAFSA or Alternative FAFSA to receive federal and/or state aid and to be eligible for free tuition at CCRI through the RI Promise Scholarship Program.

What to bring:

The following is a list of information you may* need to complete the 2024–2025 Application:

- W-2 forms or other records of income earned in 2022
- Your (and your parents, if you are dependent) 2022 Federal Income Tax Return
- Records of other untaxed income received such as child support, payments to tax-deferred pension plans, veteran's benefits, or military or clergy allowances
- Current bank statements and records of stocks, bonds and other investments
- Business or farm records, if applicable

* Ability to provide certain financial and tax information does not exclude individuals from receiving financial aid. Personal and financial information will not be shared with federal government agencies.
